Choosing pictures and artwork to hang up from Sierra Leone, Liberia, Switzerland and elsewhere has been great fun for her. We've finally begun to feel "at home" – although taking *this* many months to get settled is one tradition we hope we don't keep!

As well as continuing to work with SIM-TEC from home, I've also taken a few short, "contract" jobs installing computers from time to time to help ends meet. Cheri is putting in a lot of extra hours this year teaching second grade, as she has several children with special learning needs. Together, we enjoy teaching the teen-age Sunday School class and spending time with the teens.

We are looking forward to two trips to North Carolina planned in January: The first, January 12-14, is a SIM-Start weekend, which is part of the continuing process for Cheri to become a member of SIM. The second, January 22-26, is a retreat and meeting for the entire SIM-TEC team.

Who is SIM?

SIM (Serving In Mission) began work in 1893 as the Sudan Interior Mission in what is now northern Nigeria; today it is an interdenominational mission organization with more than 1,400 full-time members from 37 nations. These missionaries are serving in over 40 countries on five continents and two islands in the Indian Ocean. SIM is truly a community of God's people who delight to worship Him and are passionate about the Gospel, seeking to fulfill the mission of Jesus Christ in the world. We are

As we continue in this process of Cheri becoming

a part of SIM, we are hoping to have our support level up to the point that Cheri will not need to sign a contract for 2007-2008 at Lakewood Park Christian School. This way we will be free to travel and speak about the ministry we are becoming involved in.

We also want to take a vision trip of several weeks to Liberia this coming summer. This trip will be an opportunity to encourage our brothers and sisters in Liberia and will allow Cheri and me to see specifically how the Lord can use us to help ELWA Ministries (Radio ELWA and the ELWA Academy). It will also give Cheri a better sense of how to plan for setting up house permanently in that country.

Please pray with us as we transition to full-time missionary service: We are right at the half-way mark to our needed \$3,200/month to move to Liberia. There we can make a long-term contribution to the ministries of ELWA in its strategic role in strengthening the church in Liberia.

Questions we've been asked about support...

- ➤ If I send \$10 to SIM, how much of it do you and Cheri receive? ➤ All of it either as salary, housing allowance, medical insurance, retirement, or to help cover the administrative costs we incur to SIM.
- ➤ Where does the money go? ➤ Upon receipt of a response from you, Cheri and I will send you a "Gift Form" to send directly to SIM with your gift. SIM issues tax-deductible receipts for all donations for our support or ministry.
- ► How much is a "share" of support? ► SIM doesn't use "shares"; contributions can be made in whatever amount the Lord directs you to give.
- ➤ What is the difference between "ministry" and "support" donations? ➤ "Support" covers the salary, housing and other regular expenses previously mentioned. "Ministry" is a fund that we can use for ministry-related expenses (i.e., for specific expenses related to our ministry and approved by SIM).
