

Shining in the Darkness

The Lord's presence is also shining on the Liberian church that we attend on the ELWA campus. The International Church of Monrovia (ICM) this year commissioned and partially supports two Liberian missionary families to other countries in West Africa.



ICM is part of a group of churches that SIM partners with in Liberia, the Evangelical Churches of

Liberia (ECOL). There are 112 ECOL churches, in 13 of the 16 counties of Liberia. ECOL has planted 11 new churches in 2018, and have together sent 8 missionaries to other African countries (including the two from ICM).

ICM's Pastor Moses Gwole is also the ELWA

Hospital Chaplain, and makes rounds to visit patients daily. His ministry there has borne great fruit!

Through a partnership with Dallas Theological Seminary, ECOL is opening the Evangelical Seminary of West Africa (ESWA) in January, which will offer the first evangelical Master's degree in Liberia. ECOL is also conducting intensive dual-track theological and vocational training programs for bi-vocational rural pastors.

The beauty of the Lord can be seen through ICM and ECOL.



We are told that at least 40% of the children in Liberia are unschooled. ELWA Academy, with 800 Liberian students, taught by Liberian teachers in grades K-12, is making a great impact on Liberia for the Lord through Christian

education.

We also have 70 homes on the ELWA campus housing staff from ELWA, SIM missionaries, and missionaries from partner missions like Samaritan's Purse and Mission Aviation Fellowship. It often takes most of an hour at our weekly praise and prayer meetings to share all the ways God is at work in Liberia. Praise the Lord!

While Cheri and the boys stayed back in the US, still on home assignment, Alan and a team of engineers

and electricians headed back to Liberia in October to install a new generator and other equipment. Flying in Samaritan Purse's DC-8 cargo plane, they were laughing about taking "one new generator, two (airplane) wings, three transformers (a million watts!), four engines, five pilots, and many, many prayers" – a total of 64,000 pounds of cargo and passengers. It was a lot more than just a wing and a prayer!

This is the first part of a big power system upgrade to support a CT Scanner that former Fox News and MSNBC host Greta van Susteren and Franklin Graham have donated to ELWA Hospital. This promises to be the first CT Scanner in Monrovia, and the first Liberian CT Technician. This upgrade will also hopefully alleviate future electric blackouts for the whole campus. The team returned November 10th.
